Dear Parents and Carers,

As you will know last week we were instructed by Public Health England to close our Pre-School 'bubble' due to a positive COVID case in a member of staff. Thankfully the member of staff, despite feeling very unwell, is doing okay and is making a recovery. We are expecting to be able to reopen Pre-School on Tuesday 20th October. This is 14 days after the member of staff's onset of symptoms. So far, no further positive cases have been reported to the school and nursery.

I would like to take this opportunity to reassure parents that a very thorough clean of the classrooms has taken place. We are very grateful to Mr Adam Brown, who is a parent, and works with 'UltraTek'. They supplied us with a UV-C sanitising LED light system that was installed in the affected areas of the nursery to really 'deep clean' them.

Thank you for the messages of support we have received from some parents. We appreciate that this is a stressful time for everyone, both parents and school and nursery staff. Being asked to isolate is frustrating but also necessary for the greater good.

Parents Evenings


Next week parents evenings will be held for children in Year R. These meetings will allow teachers to report to parents about their children have settled into school and how they are engaging with their learning. We have offered parents the choice of a socially distanced face-to-face meetings, video calls or phone calls. Dates for children in Year 1 and Year 2 will be released after half term.

Our Learning

Recently in **Primrose Class** the children have taken great interest in books. To extend their learning staff have introduced different types of books for the children to have a look at such as pop up and interactive books as well as puppets. 'Cosy Corners' have been created so the children can take themselves off for some quite time.



The children in **Blackberry Class** have been enjoying the story 'We're going on a bear hunt' and other favourite stories, extending this interest into our sensory trays, and relating to the stories as the children retell and recall familiar parts in their own words and ideas.





In **Year R** the children have been enjoying learning in the outside area. We have seen some fantastic teamwork going on between the children. Here they are using loose parts to construct a car.

In **Year One** this week, we have been thinking about our sense of hearing. As part of this the children learned how people with a hearing impairment use their other senses to compensate. Everyone had a go at finger spelling 'hello' and some children were able to finger spell their name.





This week in **Year Two**, the children have been doing some drama to recreate what else could have happened to Grandma at the end of 'George's Marvellous Medicine.' They thought about lots of different ways including exploding, becoming invisible and even disappearing into the ground! This all helps to develop their creative writing and comprehension of the text.
