Thank you to those families that have returned their ‘Home Digital Access Surveys’ so far. We asked that they were returned by today. If you have not returned it please do so as soon as possible.

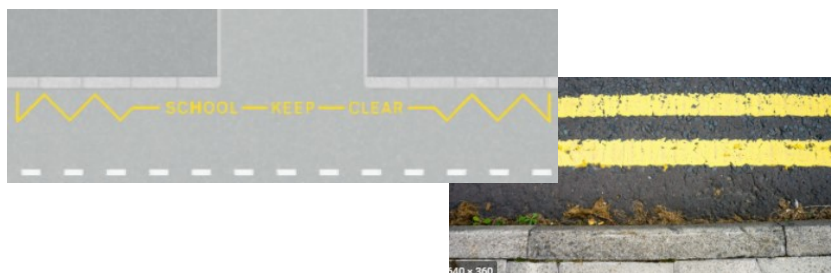
## Walk to School Week



Next week we are taking part in ‘Walk to School Week’ with all children in school. This national initiative aims to promote the physical and mental health benefits of walking as well as the ecological benefits of not using a vehicle. Exercising each day is a vital part of a healthy lifestyle which is even more important given the current situation. All children will be issued with a sticker chart and each time they walk to school they will be given a sticker to add to their chart. If they have successfully collected 5 stickers they will be awarded with a ‘Walk to School Week’ badge.

If you don’t normally walk to school, next week make a change to your routine. Consider walking even some of the way if it is not possible to walk the whole way. Get off the bus a stop early or park your car further away than normal!

## Heyward Road Traffic



In the mornings and at the end of the day vehicle traffic along Heyward Road (at the rear of the school and nursery site) is very heavy and has caused many issues including a couple of 'near misses' involving children. These issues are caused by parents parking on double yellow lines and the zig zag markings. These markings are there to keep pedestrians safe. It is illegal to park in these areas unless you are a holder of a valid Blue Badge for those with disabilities.

Traffic enforcement officers and enforcement cameras are often in use along Heyward Road and Bramble Road to ensure everyone's safety. The school and nursery is also considering taking part in an initiative to introduce temporary road closures on streets around school sites.

Please respect the safety of all road users, local residents and our children by not parking where you shouldn't.

## Autumnal Weather

As the weather is making a seasonal change at the moment please send your children into school and nursery with appropriate clothing, including a waterproof coat and robust footwear.

If you would like to send your child in with wellington boots you may but they will also need a change of shoes to wear during the day.

Please remember to name all items of clothing including coats and footwear.

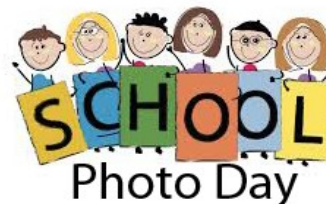


## School Photographer
