Home Learning

Children in school are provided with home learning activities on a weekly basis. These are designed to reinforce learning that is taking place in the classroom and to allow the children to practise key new skills (such as spelling or recall of maths facts) that they have learnt.

This year we have moved much of our home learning online via the Tapestry Online Journal to reduce the potential risk of infection spreading. Teachers have noticed that there are a lot fewer families engaging with home learning activities at present.
